# **January 2022 Newsletter**





A Happy New Year to all of our families—let's hope 2022 is a smoother year than 2021 was. I am delighted that school closures have not been forced on us and I am optimistic that we will be able to enjoy a more 'normal' school year, if there is such a thing!

On behalf of all staff, I would like to thank you for the unbelievably generous Christmas gifts and the donations which we will put towards an epic 'Infant Team vs Junior Team' Escape Room battle. I know who my money's on.....

We have much to look forward to in 2022. We intend to take the children to Cadburys World as part of our 'Inspirational Inventions' Big Idea and visit the Blists Hill Victorian Town to learn more about life 150 years ago. In addition, the juniors have the re-arranged Young Voices concert on 28th April and intend to visit Cromford Canal and walk to the Arkwright Mills. Mr Wraith and I are excited for the return of inter-school sporting fixtures as the weather improves.

Our Year 6 children have begun the run-up to their SATs assessments in May and I have great confidence in them because of their tremendous attitude to work and the progress they have already made this year.

#### **New School Website**

Our new website has had lots of traffic (thank you if you've found time to have a look) and I am working hard to keep it up-to-date and detailed with helpful information and links.

#### Learning

This term, our Big Idea is 'Inspirational Inventions'. The children will learn about life in the Victorian period and **the Juniors** will read Gaslight (chosen after a class vote!) and Hetty Feather. In maths, we will begin by reading and drawing line graphs before looking at other ways of presenting data. In art & DT we will learn about and create impressionist paintings and become 'chocolatiers' designing and making a chocolate box and then creating our own delicious chocolates to present to the class. In science we will learn about materials and use IMotion to create our own animations in Computing. We hope to visit Pugin's church in Derby as part of our RE work and Mr Wraith is looking forward to delivering hockey lessons to all children.

In the Infants the children will continue with their fantastic phonics and read Charlie and the Chocolate Factory as our main text. In Maths we will focus on the four number operations before revisiting fractions and shape. In science we will learn about humans and other living creatures and about what keeps us healthy and makes a healthy lifestyle.

#### 1-1 Tutoring

Mrs Bennett and Miss Beresford have done an excellent job delivering additional teaching sessions to selected children. The impact of their hard work on the children's academic progress is clear to see. For this half term, Miss Beresford is away completing her final teaching placement before achieving Qualified Teacher Status. I am grateful that Mrs Bennett has agreed to take on some extra sessions whilst Miss Beresford is unavailable. To repeat, please do not be concerned if your child is or is not selected for 1-1 tutoring. These are 'bonus' targeted sessions aimed at children across the academic spectrum.

#### **Knowledge Organisers**

A challenge for all schools is to develop a meaningful method of assessing pupil-progress in subjects other than maths, English and science. We see the use of knowledge organisers—a single or double-side of A4 which outlines exactly what is to be taught in the unit as a potential means of solving this challenge. The children will bring home copies of the knowledge organisers for key subjects, which will also be uploaded to the school website. At the beginning and end of each unit, children will be asked 6 open-ended questions and these answers alongside their work in class will be used to track their progress and attainment.

#### **Playground Refurbishment**

The difficulties we have experienced finding builders willing and able to quote and complete our playground refurbishment was one of my biggest frustrations of 2021. We do have a company visiting the playground to quote on January 20th and I can assure you that Mrs Horobin and I will do everything we can to secure a completion date for the new playground as quickly as possible.

# **Young Voices Concert**

I am delighted that the Young Voices concert has not been cancelled but postponed. We will now take part in the concert on Thursday 28th April. f you have been to a Young Voices concert in the past you will know what a special experience it is. The children are given a range of songs to learn and join around 7000 others at Sheffield Arena in January. More details, including ticket information for parents who may want to attend the concert are available on the YV website.

#### **Mugginton Mile**

The Mugginton Mile will continue on Tuesdays and Thursdays—we had 19 children attend the first session last Tuesday. We will run at 11.40am to avoid any lesson-disruption and have the staff necessary to support all children who wish to join the run to take part. We ask that children come to school in their normal uniform on running days in case bad weather prevents us going.

# **Sports at Mugginton**

A key PE aim is that every child from Years 2—6 has the opportunity to represent our school in a sporting event each year. This term, we hope to enter a Futsal tournament as well as gymnastics, table tennis and cross country. I have no doubt that Mrs Wallen will be determined to defend our Key Stage 1 Handball championship which is always a highlight. I am very much looking forward to the return of the junior football league too and will send out fixture-dates when I have them.

I would like to thank all members of FOMS for working so hard to re-start things after such a period of disruption. We enjoyed the Christmas Gift Shop and the Christmas Fayre was terrific fun for everybody. Thank you parents who helped your children prepare the stalls and prizes.
