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## Mugginton School Parliament and Faith council 2021

### Who represents children at Mugginton?

At Mugginton we are represented by a council of 13 children. This consists of 2 children from year groups 2 through to 6 apart from in Year 6 whereby we have a total of 5 council members. In each year group, a girl and a boy is selected

School parliament reps attend at least 2 meetings per term. The meetings take place during lunch time. Mr Green, who is the Head teacher, is in attendance at all the meetings, however it is the Year 6 children that ultimately run the meeting and take Minutes. Whenever possible, Mrs Gayton, who is one of our school governors joins the meetings too.

The children who are voted on to the school council, retain their post for the whole school year and wear a badge so everybody knows their role.

### How are children elected?

We use a voting system to elect the roles of the school council representatives. Children who wish to stand for election prepare a speech that they deliver to the whole school, before each school member votes for their chosen candidate.



### How does school parliament work?

Mr Green creates a draft agenda. The children receive the agenda and then read through the agenda prior to the meeting to familiarise themselves with what will be discussed and add anything they want to discuss.

During the meeting, the children discuss the topics raised as part of the agenda. As a result of discussing the points on the agenda, decisions are made as to how to put those actions into place.

Our minute taker (Joe) then writes down everything that has been discussed as part of the meeting and the agenda and Minutes are pinned up on the 'Our Classroom' board in the junior classroom.

### **Responsibilities of the school Faith Council include**

Being a voice for the children when discussing matters involving the school.

Being responsible role models for the other children.

Contributing and get involved in organising school fundraising events in conjunction with governors.

Helping out at school fund raising events

Helping Mr Green to collect pupil voice by completing questionnaires with the infants

Going to Waterstones and other book shops with our teachers to make sure we have brilliant books in both classrooms.

Introducing the school to visitors

Speaking at Church Services and other community events



### **Other key roles children have at Mugginton**

Our teachers choose a **Head Boy and Head Girl** from Year 6 in September each year. This year our Head Boy is Archie and our Head Girl is Daisy.

The children voted to choose four **Forest Friday Leads**. They are Joe, Brayden, Alice and Seth and they look after the children in their Forest Friday groups.
