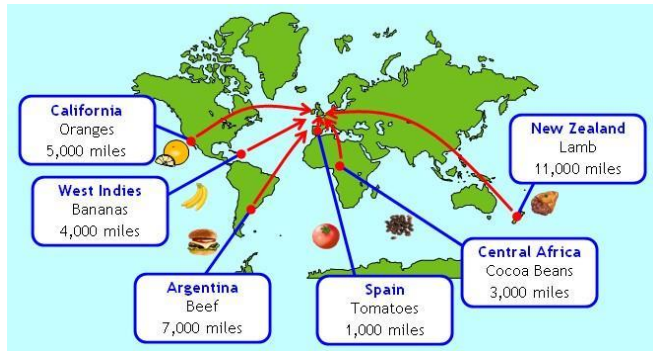


Topic Knowledge Organiser: Food, Glorious Food! Yr 1 & 2



Where does our food come from? It has often taken a long journey to get to the shops where we buy it.



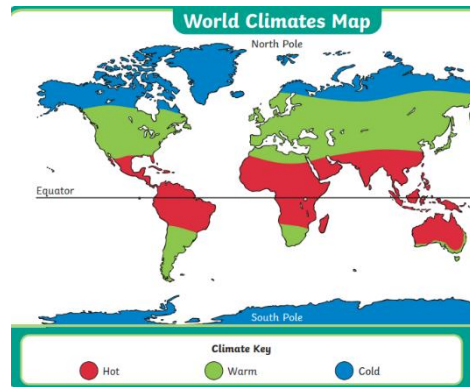
Bananas- grown in tropical regions from South America to Africa, India and China.



Cocoa beans- 70 % of the world's cocoa beans are from West African countries.



Peaches – grown in states of the USA, California, South Carolina, Georgia and New Jersey.



Coffee berries- the top producers are Brazil, Vietnam, Columbia, Ethiopia and Indonesia.

Key Vocabulary

Food production: The preparation, growing and making of food.

Farming: Growing crops or keeping animals on the farm.

Sustainable: Making sure our own needs are met and also the needs of people in the future.

Organic: A product that avoids the use of any man-made fertilisers or additives. A 'natural' product.

Fair Trade: Buying goods directly from producers in developing countries, at a fair price.

Food miles: The distance food is transported from when it is made or harvested, to the consumer.

Preservatives: A chemical that is added to make food stay fresher for longer.

Climate: The weather pattern in a particular area.

Seasonal produce: Food that is purchased and consumed around the time that it is harvested.

Healthy eating: Having a balance of different foods and nutrients.

Food source: a living plant or animal from which food comes.

Crops: Plants that are grown or harvested for profit.
